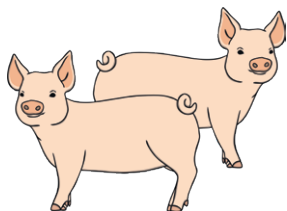




# Today, we have been learning s saying /z/.

pigs

When the letter 's' is **after an unvoiced or quiet consonant**, it is pronounced as a /s/, e.g. hats, tops, works, laughs, what's, moths. When the letter 's' is **after a voiced consonant**, it is pronounced as a /z/ sound, e.g. pigs, bugs, bags.

It can also be found at the end of some other words, such as his, has, is, as.

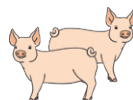
