




Class Monet Challenge Homework Spring 1 – Woodland Wildlife

Write a few paragraphs describing what that character looks like, the clothes they wear, what they like to do etc. Please remember to include adjectives, conjunctions and different sentence openers, as well as concentrating on capital letters, full stops, your spellings and keeping your handwriting as neat as you can.</p>

Visual/Spatial/Kinesthetic (Creative Arts)	<p><u>Art</u> Pick your favourite woodland animal and draw a picture of it. Try and include as much detail as you can using felt pens, paint or colouring pencils.</p>	<p><u>Geography</u> Draw a map of the route between your house and school, adding in any important landmarks or buildings along the way, such as Swanley station, Crockenhill church, village shop, village hall, etc.</p>	
School Value (Independence) and Growth Mindset	<p>Make your own breakfast or packed lunch and tidy away afterwards. Print photos or send via Dojo of you doing it. You can do this during a weekday or at the weekend. You need to have an adult supervising you, but see if you can do it without them helping you!</p>
